ETHICS ACT COMPLAINT FORM

I. READ BEFORE COMPLETING THIS FORM:

Authority to Investigate Complaints: The State Ethics Commission has the authority to investigate complaints against those persons covered by “The State Government Ethics Act” for alleged violations of the Ethics Act. Please see Chapter 138A of the North Carolina General Statutes and refer to our website for additional information. <https://ethics.nc.gov/complaints/ethics-complaints>

Statute of Limitations: This complaint must be filed within *two years* of the date you, the Complainant, knew or should have known of the conduct upon which this complaint is based. If you have known about, or should have known about, your allegations for more than two years, your complaint will be dismissed.

Jurisdiction:

- i. **State Officials Only.** Please note that the Ethics Commission’s jurisdiction is limited to specific State officials and employees. It does NOT have jurisdiction over local government officials and employees. A description and list of those persons over which the Commission has jurisdiction is posted at <https://ethics.nc.gov/coverage>.
- ii. **Limited to Specific Actions Only.** Likewise, the Commission is only empowered to investigate specific misconduct within the Ethics Act (see below).

If you file a complaint against a person who is not subject to the Ethics Act or that does not allege a violation of the specific provisions of the Ethics Act, then your complaint will be dismissed. You therefore should carefully review these requirements and contact Commission staff in advance of filing a complaint if you have any questions.

Confidentiality: By law, complaints filed with the Commission are confidential and not matters of public record. Please see G.S. 138A-12(p).

Voter Registration: You must have an active voter registration in North Carolina to file an ethics complaint. Please see G.S. 138A-12(c).

Re: Ethics Complaint Against State House Representative Kevin Crutchfield

Upon reviewing the publicly available NC House Bills Representative Crutchfield whom he was the primary sponsor of and voted in favor of poses significant ethics violations on the part of Representative Crutchfield.

Under 138A-31. Use of public position for private gain.

- (a) *Except as permitted under G.S. 138A-38, a covered person or legislative employee shall not knowingly use the covered person's or legislative employee's public position in an official action or legislative action that will result in financial benefit to the covered person or legislative employee, a member of the covered person's or legislative employee's extended family, or business with which the covered person or legislative employee is associated.*

First, Representative Crutchfield introduced the NC HB 865 - Extend Meat Processing Grant Program as the primary sponsor on April 25, 2023. Representative Crutchfield is the President and the Registered Agent of Crutchfield Farms Inc. which is a North Carolina Domestic Business Corporation incorporated on June 21, 2016. Representative Crutchfield was the primary sponsor of this bill, which proposed a government grant to farmers. Being that Representative Crutchfield is a cattle farmer he stands to directly benefit by receiving government help getting his meat products to market and therefore financially benefiting from the passage of HB 865, *ETHICAL PRINCIPLES AND GUIDELINES, Conflict of Interest, Pg, 7 Opinion 7.*

Furthermore, the following three bills are all related to signs, advertising, and sign permits.

Representative Crutchfield and his family own and operate Casco Signs Inc. (formerly known as The Crutchfield Group, Ltd.), which began operations in October 1998. Representative Crutchfield is the Chief Financial Officer of Casco Signs. Casco Signs specializes in a variety of commercial signs and printing services.

NC HB 771 - Compensation for On-Premises Sign Upgrades. This bill proposes government intervention to create revenue for his company. This bill allows business owners to receive monetary compensation for nonconforming signs due to a change in local government regulations, which generates business for Casco Signs, which is a financial benefit to their company *ETHICAL PRINCIPLES AND GUIDELINES – Conflict of Interest, Pg, 7 Opinion 7.*

H693 - Repossession of Manufactured Sign, which allows Representative Crutchfield company to repossess a sign that a customer defaulted on payment for without going through the proper channels in the courts, thereby saving Casco Signs attorney's fees, filing fees, etc. which is a financial benefit to his company *ETHICAL PRINCIPLES AND GUIDELINES – Conflict of Interest, Pg, 7 Opinion 7.*

H132 - Govt. Agencies/Delivery of Permits – This allows for issued permits to be electronically or mailed directly instead of physically picked up has been the normal practice. Not having to have someone personally pick up permits saves Casco Signs trips, time, and money. Which again is a financial benefit to their company. *ETHICAL PRINCIPLES AND GUIDELINES – Conflict of Interest, Pg, 7 Opinion 7.*

These three bills sponsored by Representative Crutchfield should not have been the primary sponsor and should have abstained from voting. Representative Crutchfield showed impaired

independence of judgment not only because of the potential financial benefit but he has special knowledge of the subject matter and industry. Representative Crutchfield placed himself in a position to influence other legislators to vote in favor of these bills due to his knowledge of the industry and the benefits to members of this industry.

§ 138A-37. Legislator participation in legislative actions.

(a) Except as permitted under G.S. 138A-38, no legislator shall participate in a legislative action if the legislator knows the legislator or a person with which the legislator is associated may incur a reasonably foreseeable financial benefit from the action, and if after considering whether the legislator's judgment would be substantially influenced by the financial benefit and considering the need for the legislator's particular contribution, including special knowledge of the subject matter to the effective functioning of the legislature, the legislator concludes that an actual financial benefit does exist which would impair the legislator's independence of judgment.

(b) The legislator shall submit in writing to the principal clerk of the house of which the legislator is a member the reasons for the abstention from participation in the legislative matter.

Finally, according to the NC Ethical Principles and Guidelines.

A legislator mentioning or permitting another to mention the office he or she holds in commercial advertising would improperly take advantage of the confidence and respect accorded that office. The office would thereby be demeaned. The legislator's actions of mentioning or permitting another to mention the legislative status in

commercial advertising would therefore be unethical. NC Ethical Principles and Guidelines, Pg.2 (4) and Option 014.

Representative Crutchfield has repeatedly posted on social media photos of himself mentioning or photographed with a logo or depicting a photo of one of his businesses. In addition, Representative Crutchfield is featured on the main “about page” of the Cosco Signs Website promoting not only himself but also his business. (See attached documents).

Lastly, Representative Crutchfield seems to have additional ethics violations with the State Board of Elections regarding receiving campaign donations from business entities.

It is unlawful for any corporation, business entity, labor union, professional association, or insurance company to directly or indirectly contribute to a candidate. N.C.G.S. § 163-278.19. The prohibition of contributions from these entities also applies to “in-kind contributions,” such as the donation of items to committees for fundraisers, or the sponsoring of holes at golf tournaments, the provision or discount of a service, such as a restaurant meal, or the provision or discount product to the committee or committee member.

The first was an advertisement for a campaign fundraiser that he held. The fundraiser was advertised as a “Beef Raffle” with the beef being donated from Crutchfield Farms, Inc. for two winners. Each winner would receive beef valued at \$1800.00 if they won the raffle, which was never documented on his campaign finance reports. (See attached documents).

In addition, Representative Crutchfield repeatedly (most recently in the Kannapolis Christmas Parade in December 2023) uses a Casco Sign vehicle with an LED billboard erected in the bed of the truck for campaign purposes. This vehicle has Cosco Sign advertising down the sides including

the website address for Cosco Signs and phone number. While this item was documented on Representative Crutchfield's campaign finance reports there are some serious ethical concerns with promoting his businesses while campaigning or not and using his status as a legislator in doing so. (See attached documents). These types of actions directly or indirectly contribute to a candidate as well as Representative Crutchfield's business.

Representative Crutchfield has continually and will continue to use his legislative position to ensure his businesses receive a financial benefit from any legislation he puts forth, as well as himself in a political capacity.

It is requested that the North Carolina Ethics Committee and the State Board of Elections, Ethics Enforcement, or other proper authority (1) promptly investigate these activities, (2) levy appropriate fines or remedial measures, and (3) order that relevant parties and organizations immediately cease any behavior found to be unlawful.

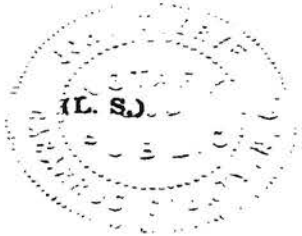



Short Title: Extend Meat Processing Grant Program.

(Public)

Sponsors: Representative Crutchfield.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO RENEW AND PROVIDE ADDITIONAL FUNDS FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE AND CONSUMER SERVICES' INCREASING MEAT PRODUCTION, EFFICIENCY, AND CAPACITY GRANT PROGRAM.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Findings. – The General Assembly finds that the COVID-19 pandemic of 2020-2021 resulted in serious and substantial impacts on the food supply chain and revealed bottlenecks and lack of capacity among the small and independent meat processors and producers of further processed meat products who serve small livestock producers. These bottlenecks and lack of capacity have a substantial negative impact on the ability of these small livestock producers to have their livestock slaughtered and processed. In addition, seafood processors lack capacity to meet increased and altered consumer demand for seafood products due to supply chain disruptions and other long-term changes in the market for seafood and seafood products. The General Assembly further finds that continued financial assistance to these processors for expansion, facility improvements, and workforce development is necessary to reduce disruptions in the supply chain for fresh meat and seafood and to help small producers get their products to market.

SECTION 2. Use of Funds and Limitation. – The sum of twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000) in nonrecurring funds for each year of the 2023-2025 fiscal biennium is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services for grants to meat and seafood processors as specified in this section to reduce or prevent impacts on the supply chain for fresh meat in the State and to improve the resiliency of the fresh meat and seafood supply chain to future disruptions. The following limitations and reservations apply:

- (1) No more than two million dollars (\$2,000,000) of the funds allocated in this section may be used to supplement grants previously awarded to reflect construction cost inflation.
- (2) No more than three percent (3%) of the total funds allocated in this section may be used for technical and administrative support.

SECTION 3. Grant Types and Criteria. – The Department shall develop policies and procedures for the disbursement of the grants authorized by this section that include, at a minimum, the following:

- (1) The Department may provide three categories of grants:
 - a. Capacity enhancement grant. – This grant is available to an eligible meat or seafood processing facility that is experiencing slowdowns in production or has limited capacity to accommodate increased demand for meat or seafood processing. A capacity enhancement grant may be



- 1 used for expansion of an existing eligible facility and for fixtures or
2 equipment at an existing eligible facility that will expand animal
3 throughput, processing capacity, the amount or type of products
4 produced, or processing speed.
- 5 b. Workforce development grant. – This grant is available to an eligible
6 meat or seafood processing facility that is experiencing slowdowns in
7 production or has limited capacity to accommodate increased demand
8 for meat or seafood processing due to workforce limitations or
9 reductions due to a pandemic or other natural disaster. A workforce
10 development grant may be used for educational and workforce training
11 provided either by the facility or by an accredited institution of higher
12 education.
- 13 c. Planning grant. – This grant is available to a nonprofit entity or
14 institution of higher education to complete feasibility or siting studies
15 for a new eligible meat processing facility.
- 16 (2) Eligible facility. – For purposes of this section, an eligible meat or seafood
17 processing facility includes the following:
- 18 a. A food processing facility that meets both of the following
19 requirements:
- 20 1. The plant contracts with independent livestock producers or
21 seafood harvesters to process animals or seafood.
- 22 2. The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA)
23 contracts with Department inspectors to conduct federal
24 inspection activities authorized by the Talmadge-Aiken Act of
25 1962 (7 U.S.C. § 1633) at the plant, the plant is otherwise
26 regulated by the USDA or the United States Food and Drug
27 Administration, or the plant is a State-inspected facility.
- 28 b. A facility producing further processed meat products for which the
29 USDA contracts with Department inspectors to conduct federal
30 inspection activities authorized by the Talmadge-Aiken Act of 1962
31 (7 U.S.C. § 1633) at the plant, or which is a State-inspected facility, or
32 which is a USDA-inspected processor of shelf-stable meat or meat
33 products.
- 34 (3) Prioritization. – The Department may prioritize projects that will create
35 additional jobs.
- 36 (4) Cost-sharing. – Recipients shall provide matching funds for a grant under this
37 section in the amount of one dollar (\$1.00) from nongrant sources for every
38 two dollars (\$2.00) provided by the grant.
- 39 (5) Clawback. – If fixtures or equipment purchased with grant funds provided
40 under this Article are disposed of during a period of time as the Department
41 shall specify following the date the fixtures or equipment funded by this act
42 are placed in service, the grant recipient shall repay to the Department a
43 proportionate share of the grant funding received as the Department shall
44 specify. As used in this subdivision, the term "disposed of" means disposed
45 of, taken out of service, or moved out of State.

46 **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2023.

HOUSE BILL DRH10377-MQ-52A

Short Title: Compensation for On-Premises Sign Upgrades. (Public)

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 **SECTION 1.** Part 1 of Article 9 of Chapter 160D of the General Statutes is amended
8 by adding a new section to read:

9 "**§ 160D-912.1. On-premises advertisements.**

10 (a) As used in this section, the following definitions apply:

11 (1) Nonconforming sign. – An on-premises advertisement that was lawfully
12 installed but which does not comply with current ordinances or regulations
13 due to changed conditions.

14 (2) On-premises advertisement. – A sign identifying or advertising a business,
15 person, activity, goods, products, or services located on the premises where
16 the sign is installed and maintained.

17 (b) A local government may not enact or amend an ordinance of general applicability to
18 require the owner of a nonconforming sign to bring the sign into compliance with current
19 regulations without the payment of monetary compensation to the owner of the nonconforming
20 sign. Upon payment of monetary compensation for the sign, the local government shall own the
21 sign. In lieu of payment of monetary compensation to the owner of the nonconforming sign, a
22 local government may reimburse the owner an amount equal to the difference of the fair market
23 value of the nonconforming sign and the reasonable cost to bring the sign into compliance.

24 (c) Monetary compensation is the fair market value of the nonconforming sign in place
25 immediately prior to its removal and without consideration of the effect of the ordinance or any
26 diminution in value caused by the ordinance requiring its removal. Monetary compensation shall
27 be determined using the factors listed in G.S. 105-317.1(a).

28 (d) Monetary compensation or reimbursement is not required under this section for any
29 of the following:

30 (1) The local government and the owner of the nonconforming sign enter into a
31 voluntary agreement allowing for the removal of the sign after a set period of
32 time in lieu of monetary compensation. A local government may adopt an
33 ordinance or resolution providing for a relocation, reconstruction, or removal
34 agreement.

35 (2) The nonconforming sign is determined to be a public nuisance or detrimental
36 to the health or safety of the populace.



1 (3) The removal of the nonconforming sign is required for opening, widening,
2 extending, or improving streets or sidewalks, or for establishing, extending,
3 enlarging, or improving any of the public enterprises listed in G.S. 160A-311,

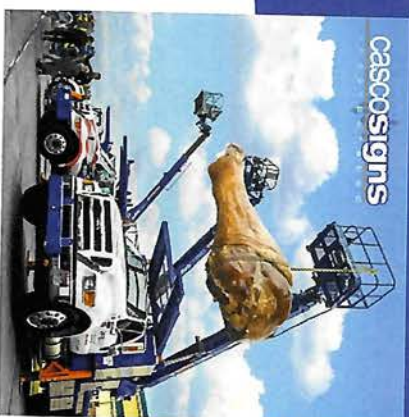
